From the Editor

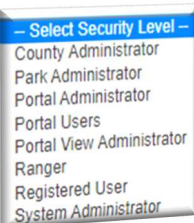
MyCountyParks.com has been “morphing around” in some shape or form since the original purchase of the URL in 2006 – shedding versions of itself as technology and financial support have allowed it to do so. 2023 finds us amidst the challenging task of a huge website renovation - that will “set the table” for years to come for our county conservation system’s internet presence!

General Site Improvements:



1. Create SERVICE REQUEST / SUPPORT button functionality in the County Admin with required protocols. (Priority) (Currently using a fillable PDF document w/o ability to REQUIRE fields)
 - a. To create a SERVICE REQUEST (or SUPPORT) form for the County Admin Role.
 - b. The filled forms will be viewed by System Administrator.

For the past 18 months or so, we have received over 75 requests for improvements & new functionalities for the website. These have been reviewed, investigated and refined in consult with Informatics, Inc. – our host and developer for MyCountyParks.com. We now have a several phase, working document of prioritized mini-projects that will blend into the overall re-do of the website. The majority of these upgrades are administrative in nature – providing additional and expanded ease of use by both administrators and customers that utilize the website.



The MCP.com website has **175,971** user profiles registered in the operational database. Most websites the size of ours would have a team of 5-8 specialists dedicated to management, maintenance and operations. From the beginning, we recognized the need for each CCB to have their own ability to develop & utilize their portion of the site to fit their local program & needs. For 2023 – we have **440** individuals that have some level of administrative privileges for working on the website, with the bulk of these being our **305 County Administrators**. Each of Iowa’s 99 CCBs have at least one of these County Administrators (*that have full-access to ALL aspects of the functionalities for their county*). Due to scope of operations, and staff engagement with the website - some CCBs have more than 20. Over the past couple of years, we have noted that not all CCBs have a good transition plan – should their key MCP website person leave the CCB. If you are perhaps one the CCBs with only one “MCP-knowledgeable” person on staff – you should at least have one “under-study” person up-trained to a minimum level of understanding for your CCB’s current utilization of the website?! 😊

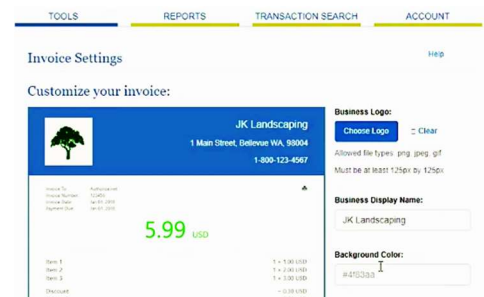

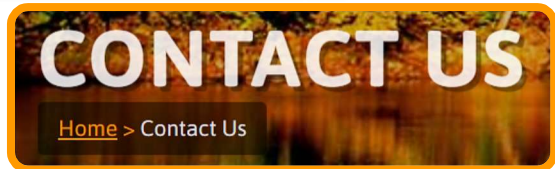

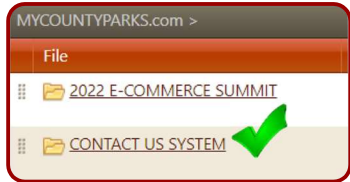

CONTACT US EMAILS / CONFIRMATION EMAILS – Over the past couple of months – we have worked with several local CCBs to troubleshoot either missing emails, or changes within their local email server environments. Generally, these issues come about due to circumstances within the county in some way as there are **NO WHOLESALE CHANGES** occurring with the MCP.com systems during this time. Your local email provider MAY have stopped providing support forwarding for an old email, your IT Dept. MAY have migrated hosting to a new server environment, etc. As a reminder – there are several places within MyCountyParks that automated emails are generated when certain functions occur: **1)** When a site user submits a “Contact Us” communication; **2)** When a customer reserves a park facility or registers for a program/event; **3)** When a site user makes an Online Donation to a CCB. When you change an email address on your end that may be connected with the website – please remember to check-in with Tom to confirm that we have your connections up-to-date with the proper information. **TO THAT END** – we have placed the current listing of ALL 99 MCP.com CONTACT emails in the IACCB Portal in the parent file “MyCountyParks.com”, and subfile “**CONTACT US SYSTEM**”. *(This listing, plus additional information is also attached to this communication)* **Please review this listing for your CCB’s specific email** that is embedded within MCP.com – if it is CORRECT, you need to do nothing; if it is INCORRECT – please contact MCPAdmin@mycountyparks.org and provide us with the updated email address you would like these communications to go to!



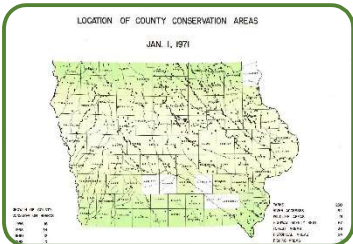
ALSO THIS MONTH – We wanted to let you know that our subscription for the software that hosted the online version of our **County Conservation Guide to Outdoor Adventure** on MyCountyParks.com has expired. Persons attempting to access the guide for the past several weeks have been met with the pop-up notice seen here to the left. *(The guidebook has been available via the link “Interactive Guide” at the top of every page of the website since 2013.*

We have successfully transferred the posting of our 242-page Guidebook to a new page on our MyCountyParks.org website – which has been re-connected with the “Interactive Guide” tab/link on MyCountyParks.com. This will only serve as a temporary “FIX” for access to this once-popular guidebook. A nearly two-year survey & discussion amongst CCB professionals at District and Division meetings about reprinting the guidebook has yielded near-zero interest in doing so. The book was last updated and reprinted in 2012. As the MyCountyParks.com website has evolved and morphed – we have always been in hopes that the website would eclipse the need for any future printings of a “guidebook” for Iowa’s CCB system.

The current overhaul of the MCP.com website is being undertaken with the background knowledge of this need, and will not feature a connecting tab to the PDF “hard copy” in the new version. If you think about all the changes within the 99-CCB system over the past 12 years – you can grasp the scope of the out-of-date-ness of the “current” 2012 edition. While it may be approximately 80% accurate, and the maps relatively intact – there is certainly much information & data that is missing.

The “Guidebook” and its predecessor - “**The County Conservation Directory**” have been a printed staple available from the CCB statewide system since the mid-1960s – so, after a nearly 60-year existence.... it is time to defer to a readily-updatable new digital persona 😊

MCP.com UPDATED TO ALLOW LONGER EMAIL EXTENSIONS!

Earlier this April, **Polk CCB** first brought this to our attention when they had a person attempting to register for a program – but the website would not recognize her email address. Turned out that the email address ended with the domain extension “.school” – which is a 6-character extension and twice as long as the standard .edu, .org, .com, etc. Our investigation found that there is indeed significant expansion in this arena with more options for these extensions. There are numerous places on MCP.com where users may need to enter an email address to request more information, register for an event or to reserve a facility. As of April 24th, the website has been “retro-fitted” to allow for these expanded email addresses.....if something else mystifies you – let us know! ☺

CCBs INNOVATING NEW PATHS FORWARD

HARDIN CCB – Recognizing the need to better manage the issue of Service Animals in their cabins which have a “No Pets” policy, the HCCB established a **Pet & Service Animal Policy**. They then further incorporated a **Service Animal Registration** process utilizing Google Docs for the form & documentation. - **Pet & Service Animal Policy:** No pets allowed in the cabins. A therapy animal is considered the same as a pet under the law and this policy, and therefore is not a service animal or service-animal-in-training. A service animal or service-animal-in-training is not a pet. A person with a disability has a right to be accompanied by a service animal or service-animal-in-training, provided the animal is under control, without being required to make additional payment for lodging. Renters who plan on bringing a service animal are required to complete a Service Animal Registration.

Q. R. CODES - DESTINATION vs. DYNAMIC

And – don’t mess with the navigation train! As referenced in earlier communications, the **QR codes** generated by MCP.com are known as “**Destination**” QR Codes. This means that once they are created – the navigation URL to that location cannot be changed as the particular URL is embedded in within the QR matrix.

EXAMPLE #1 – QR Code for a CCB’s Home Page on MCP.com: These were created in 2011 to be printed in the 2012 County Conservation Guide to Outdoor Adventure. They remain functional to this day as the URL to each CCB’s home page has never changed (See Adair CCB below)

EXAMPLE #2 – QR Code for WINTERFEST 2023: This was created in Oct. '22 for use through the event in January 2023. While the URL for the Event never changed – we were able to update the information and links contained on the event page – as they were not embedded into the QR Code URL itself. This allows ease of use as long as the navigation below does not change:

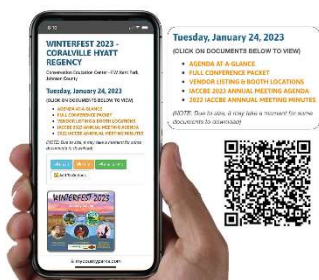

EXAMPLE #3 – QR Code for FACILITIES: Remember, **Destination QR Codes** have the entire URL of the facility embedded in the code. In this example – if the campsite was originally designated as a “Walk-in”, and included that in the name of the facility - it would work just fine. If the CCB would later upgrade the facility to “Reservable” and thusly changed the name of the campsite and original URL – then the QR Code would be voided and no longer functionable. A new QR Code would need to be generated. So, when titling events or facilities in anticipation of utilizing QR Codes for marketing, registrations, reservations, etc. for a longer term – be sure to consider the longevity of the name/title as that will affect the longevity of the QR Code. ☺

With the above information in our development & planning knowledge base – we are exploring the process of transitioning to “Dynamic” QR Codes in the future, while preserving the functionalities of those already created. Dynamic codes are much shorter in length, and would allow such changes as that referenced above for the change in campsite operations.

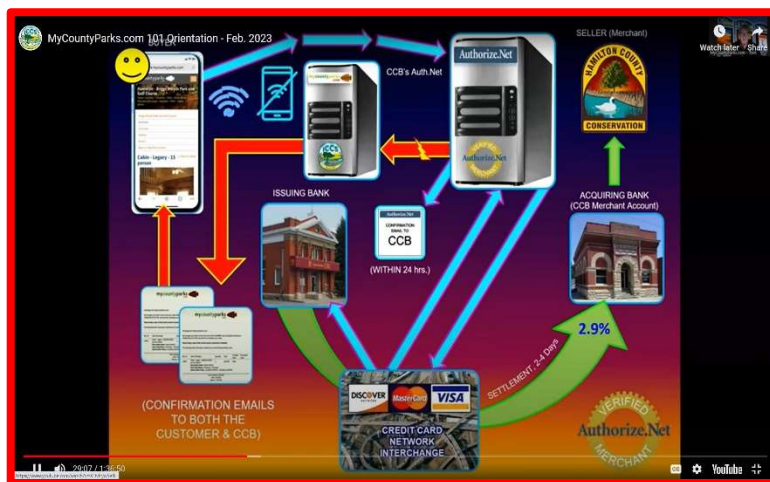
