Reflections at the end of a calendar year are an annual tradition – celebrating victories, wondering about those “might-have-beens”, and always learning from what has transpired. 2018 will be remembered as one incredible year for Iowa’s County Conservation System...

- A 98% favorable statewide vote in September converted the essential structure of IACCB to one of eight Divisions, re-vamped the Board of Directors with new Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation – emerging as [Iowa's County Conservation System \(ICCS\)](#)
- An all-new part time Administrative Assistant position was created and filled via a partnership with the Mitchell CCB – placing [Daniele Dorsey](#) into this position.
- A new ICCS logo was adopted to assist with moving forward - incorporating a new brand identity and marketing efforts
- Version 6 of MyCountyParks.com was launched in May with the new internal Organizational Event Registration System
- MyCountyParks.org is launched to serve the administrative needs of our growing industry.
- MyCountyParks.com signs up its 90,560th Registered User
- 21,910 online reservations generate \$2.2 million dollars for 26 CCBs
- A new reservation Processing Fee System generates over \$41,000 to support website development & maintenance as well as ICCS Administration.
- The CCB full-time workforce increased by 9 positions to 744 statewide
- After bottoming at a low 13.43 average years of service in FY2018, that average increased to 13.56 years in FY2019.
- Progress continued with our collective efforts to fund the Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund....optimism is in place for 2019!

REMINDER OF THE MCP.COM PROCESSING FEE INCREASE ON 1/1/19

As announced in our November ICCS Newsletter – the **Processing Fee for facilities** reserved through the MCP.com website will be increasing to \$4 per-facility-in-the-cart. This rate mirrors the fee that the DNR assesses customers for the same service via their Reserve America reservation system. This increase was necessary to support the future operations, development and management of the expanding MyCountyParks.com website. ALL CCBs will continue to financially support the site operations through a portion of their annual ICCS Membership. Keeping pace with rapidly changing technology advances, improving data collection/manipulation, and expanding both user and admin functionalities all dictate a reliable and dedicated funding stream. Additionally, we will need to be developing a dynamically functional APP for users to engage the website for reservations within the next two years. We are preparing for 80+% of all reservations made through the site by 2021 to be done on smart phones and tablets. Once again – WE APPRECIATE all the support, feedback and patience as we wrangle with what the future is demanding we be ready for....it really is an amazing “animal”! 😊

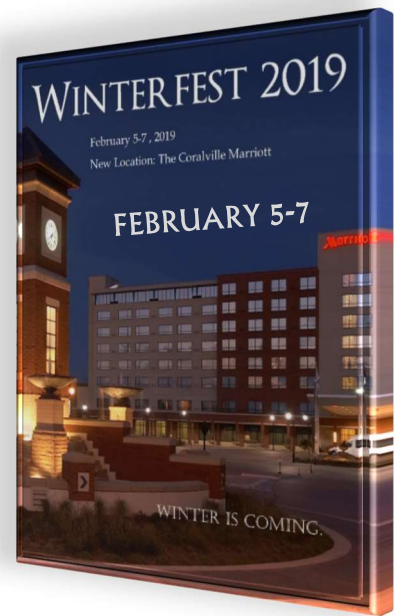

RINGGOLD CO. ACQUIRES NEW PARK!

Ringgold County Conservation is excited to announce that on September 1st, 2018 they acquired a new property previously known as the Mount Ayr Reservoir or nicknamed the "Old Lake" from the City of Mount Ayr. This 40-acre park boasts a 12.5 acre lake and shelter house with a lot of open space for new development!

The multiple public hearings about the property exchange were overwhelmingly supportive. After more than a year of working together with the City Council, the Conservation Board is pleased with the results. Both entities wanted to do what was best for the communities of Ringgold County. This takes much consideration and is not an easy decision for either board. "This has been a great partnership from the start. We both wanted to do what was right for the "old lake" and for the people of Ringgold County. It takes time to contemplate all the avenues we could have taken, but ultimately this was the right fit," said Kate Zimmerman, Director for the Ringgold CCB.

Ringgold County Conservation is excited to move forward with plans for developing the area. The long-term plans for the area include cabins, shower house, lodge and more! These larger components will be accomplished with grants and donations. Zimmer notes that they are excited to tackle this project and to be able to develop such a wonderful asset for the communities of Ringgold County. Iowa Department of Natural Resources Land Inventory

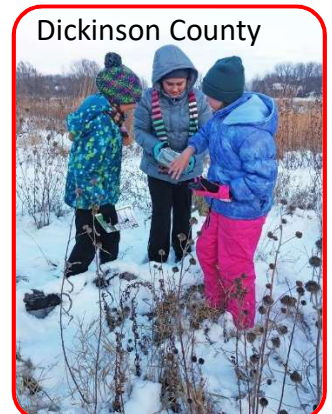
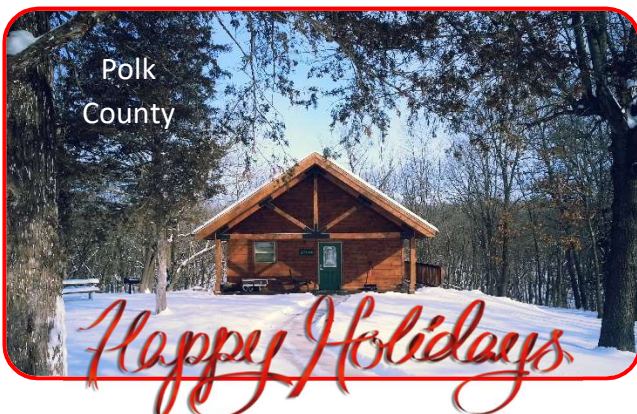

BUILDING YOUR IWILL TOOLBOX FOR 2019!

So, the sprint through the **2019 Iowa Legislative Session** is getting' rolling! There WILL be a battle to fully fund **REAP** (as there has been for 30 years!), there WILL be challenges to the formula that guides the funding streams in the **Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Fund (IWILL)**. Resources are beginning to emerge for you to utilize as tools to educate yourselves, as well as for educating others or advocating for either of these essential programs. We have created a new "IWILL 2019" file in the PORTAL that we are placing these resources as they become available to us.

CCB Directors have already heard from the CCDA Legislative Committee with information about a grassroots initiative that is percolating it's way through the County Boards of Health – sample policy statements and educational flyers are in the PORTAL. This is tremendous support for the effort, and coming from a slightly different direction – emphasizing healthy lifestyles, quality of life and addressing the childhood obesity issue. We encourage you to engage with your local County Boards of Health as they have all received communications and materials from their statewide leadership!

A **"Virtual Day at the Capitol"** has been scheduled for **Tuesday, February 12th** for an advocacy effort on behalf of the Trust Fund. We have done these in the past where we ask that you rally folks to take time on that day to utilize social media and email to contact all of your local legislators and let them know why funding the trust is important locally – referring to Un-Met Needs, etc. Look forward to more information to be forthcoming on lots of stuff!

PUBLIC HEALTH

Iowans of all ages and abilities enjoy better health and well-being when being surrounded by nature. Whether it's hiking new trails and streams, forests and greenways, or parks and trails, our connections to the outdoors is vital to Iowa's public health.

Public health officials strongly support funding Iowa's Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund with a sales tax increase of at least 3.0 of one cent, which is supported by nearly 70% of Iowans across the state.

Beyond the economic, capital growth, tourism sales, and conservation benefits the Trust Fund will provide to our state, the broad public health implications and importance of ensuring our children and future generations of Iowans have a healthy community to grow up in is more important than ever.

For these public health concerns and so many more, the Iowa's Water and Land Legacy coalition encourage the 2019 Iowa Legislature to take a strong and swift approach to passing the sales tax increase to fund the Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund and honor their commitment to the great constituents they serve across Iowa.

The time is now.
It's our money.
Fund the Trust.



The preservation and investments to protect Iowa's green spaces, water and air quality can be key to improving the health of current and future Iowans.

A child's risk for obesity can increase by as much as 50% if they live in a neighborhood void of parks, sidewalks, and other green space or recreational amenities.

Our neighboring state Nebraska reported a \$3 million increase in direct health care savings for every \$1 invested into trail infrastructure.

Children with easy access to outdoor recreation and green space have a higher likelihood of being physically active and performing better in school.

Numerous studies prove that separation from nature is detrimental to one's physical health and mental well-being.

Today, nearly 1 in every 5 Iowa children is classified as obese. Children with Type 2 Diabetes, hypertension and other chronic conditions are on the rise. Symptoms and severe health outcomes are appearing up in our children at younger and younger ages in comparison to our parents' generation. But thanks to Iowans' support of the Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund, we have the opportunity to redirect the course of our children and provide a strong environment that supports their health and well-being.



IOWA REAP BENEFITS RESOURCE ENHANCEMENT AND PROTECTION

The goal of REAP is to improve Iowa's natural resources and cultural amenities by providing a dedicated funding mechanism for grants and projects. The program encourages public-private partnerships to accomplish results. Since 1989, more than \$450 million has been invested across all of Iowa's 99 counties.

- Improve quality of life
- Enhance local economies
- Protect water and land resources
- Expand wildlife habitat
- Create recreational opportunities
- Preserve historic sites
- Beautify landscapes
- Educate Iowans, and much more!

How does the funding work?

Each year, the Iowa Legislature appropriates a dollar-for-dollar matching grant to the counties that amount, the first \$100,000 goes to conservation education and the second \$100,000 goes to administrative costs. From there:



50% County Conservation

A GENERATION ON HOLD?

Iowans need to collectively invest in the future of our state – our communities, our quality of life and our natural resources. Choosing not to do so will continue the migration of our young people & workforce out of Iowa, double-digit population decline in many rural counties will continue, and poor water quality (recreational and drinking) will just remain a part of everyday life.

Most of us likely have our own definitions of what "Quality of Life" means to us. But clearly, healthy natural resources and vibrant outdoor recreation opportunities are near the top of all lists. Since 1965, Iowa's County Conservation System has been working locally with landowners, elected officials, various stakeholder groups and the public to provide these resources. While our surrounding states have embraced bold opportunities to engage the challenges – we find ourselves a generation behind in keeping pace with the preservation, development and addition of these life enhancements.

Additionally – much of the aging infrastructure of our public recreation facilities and trails need our attention and support. It is well known that young people will seek places to live, work & play which provide the life style and adventures that they are looking for. Integrating rural Iowa with trail connections, outdoor education & recreational opportunities is a "must do" if we hope to not only retain, but to also engineer growth and retention of our workforce across the state.

Portions of the **Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund** specifically target underserved population areas, and in turn will support improved economic vitality of those rural areas. Simply put... **Fund the Trust in 2019!**

Historically, there are few programs that have benefited each of Iowa's 99 counties as successfully as the Resource Enhancement and Protection (REAP) program has for the past 30 years. In much the same way – so will funding the **Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund**. Today, nearly 1 in every 5 Iowa children are classified as obese – what better way to turn this trend in the other direction than to engage our kids with outdoor recreation and natural resources? The People of Iowa have asked that The Trust be funded, the time is at hand.
