






NOT A MAP OF SHAME.....






NEW ERA = NEW DIVISION!


This is a known issue as we prepare to say goodbye to **Adobe Flash Player** in 2021. This is due to a setting in your browser that has a simple threestep fix. (*This example reflects a Chrome browser, others are similar*)

STEP 1. Locate the padlock icon that is generally located to the left of your browser window. Left-click on this icon and a dropdown menu appears.

STEP 2. Locate the "Flash" line and its selection box. One click open the dropdown menu in this box, and select "Allow". Click anywhere outside of the dropdown boxes and they will disappear.

STEP 3. A new "Reload" selection button will appear near your browser window that will allow you to reload your browser. Click on this button, and your "Go to Portal" button and other navigation should reappear.

2019 URBAN YOUTH CORPS PROGRAMS - IOWA D.O.T.

The lowa Department of Transportation is seeking private, nonprofit, and public organizations/agencies to submit applications to participate in the 2019 Urban Youth Corps (UYC) program. The program's objectives are to provide transportation-related work projects and training opportunities to youth between the ages of 16 and 25 and to accomplish meaningful and productive improvements to transportation facilities. A total of \$80,000 is available for the 2019 UYC program. Each sponsoring agency is required to provide 20 percent of the total project cost as a local match. **DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION IS MARCH 1**st.
