# CCB MARKETPLACE ON MCP.COM?

MUCH APPRECIATION to the 35+ CCBs that have responded to our Feb. 13th survey about potentially integrating a "Marketplace" into the features of our next version of MyCountyParks.com. 89% of respondents (32% Yes & 57% likely in the future) indicated an interest, and 11% indicated no interest at this time. Participants also indicated that they would likely utilize the feature for: Merchandise (83%); Equipment Rentals (79%); Services (26%); Other (25%). Other included: tree seedlings, trail passes, food/beverage concessions, etc. We also appreciate the comments provided to assist us in evaluating & prioritizing this aspect of the broader redevelopment of the website! ©



#### Q.R. CODES - DYNAMIC vs. DESTINATION CODES

It is exciting that many CCBs are taking advantage of the QR code generation that is available through MyCountyParks.com for both facilities and events! As a reminder – the codes generated by MCP.com are "Destination" codes....meaning that the code contains a static URL to send the scanner to a specific internet destination. Once generated, that code is only good as long as there are no changes to the URL. In the example below – any change to the name of the county, park or name of the facility will render the QR Code to be inoperable. Another example is the QR Code that was available for agenda and meeting information at Winterfest 2023.....while we changed the information available by scanning the code numerous times in the background – the URL (specifically the Title of the event) remained operable as there were no changes made to the navigational map to the Destination. We hope this logic assists you with understanding the functionality of these Q.R. Codes.

#### DISTRICT II MEETINTG

Wright County CCB shared their successful approach to cooperative conservation at a very cold District II meeting. Fisheries Biologist Scott Grummer illustrated how including the public in efforts to restore the Lake Cornelia fishery with a yellow bass tournament helped control the population while gaining local support for the project.

After some awesome street tacos, Director Eric Rector explained how their latest acquisition will serve as a model for blending conservation and agriculture. This parcel has a mix of wetland, prairie, and crop ground that has a low CSR. Wright county will lease 100 acres to a young farmer for \$200/acre and require several conservation practices to be implemented. The idea is to ensure that the land, the operator, and the public all come out ahead!

The Iowa Ornithologists' Union is once again requesting applications for their Special Projects Grants for 2023. They have funds available for disbursement to projects that increase the conservation and education of Iowa's birds.
