

This has been accomplished with the new "COVID-19 UPDATES" link at the bottom of all pages on our MyCountyParks.com website. As noted above, we encourage the other 27 counties to get involved, and for all to keep us updated w/changes.

In tandem with our public outreach efforts, we have also established the **COVID-19 INFORMATION FOLDER in the ICCS Portal**. 
