

## **GOT BARN OWL BOXES?**

Anna Buckhardt Thomas is the new Avian Ecologist for the Iowa DNR. Many of you may have known/worked with Bruce Ehresman who held the position before her. Bruce made a large effort to increase Barn Owl populations in Iowa by installing Barn Owl nest boxes on public land throughout the state. Anna is interested in monitoring the use of the boxes in order to quantify the success of the DNRs efforts and to inform future barn owl conservation. Her first challenge is to locate all of the boxes. Bruce had worked with some County Conservation Boards to put boxes on their properties, but records are somewhat sketchy. Anna is hoping to create a robust monitoring program for as many nest boxes as possible, and further hoping to partner with County Conservation to increase the number of boxes included in this monitoring effort ©

#### A brief overview of what would be asked from CCB partners:

- 1. Coordinates of the locations of any Barn Owl boxes on CCB land
- 2. The year the box was installed (if known)
- 3. Help monitoring the boxes by visiting each box three times between May and July each year (She would be sure to share a more detailed protocol with any CCB partners helping with this). Each box check should take no more than 10 minutes. If CCBs have boxes but are not able to help with monitoring, Anna would still appreciate knowing where the boxes are and may be able to help with the box checks. 




#### IOWA WILDLIFE HABITAT STAMP GRANT PROGRAM GUIDELINES

The "landscape has changed" slightly in the way that CCBs should craft applications for Habitat Stamp Grant funding in the future. Additional funds have become available – but ARE NOT available for land acquisition. All CCB Directors have previously received this information, but we also wish to share with everyone these two documents from the **Wildlife Habitat Stamp Review & Selection Committee**. One is a memo to all Directors, and the other is a copy of **grant writing guidelines for this program** that were updated this past summer. 




