REAP CONGRESS

Winter weather hit hard on the week of January 12th, causing the Congress to postpone until the following week. The Congress persisted with just 55 of the original 90 Delegates representing 431 Iowans that attended this year's assemblies. Nonetheless, the delegates did their job of making recommendations to the Governor and Iowa legislature and thanking them for their ongoing support of the REAP program.

Several important motions were approved by the Congress that were critical to the REAP program's future success. The first motion was to eliminate the Sunset Date and make REAP a permanent program. Next, several motions were made to fully fund REAP at 20 million and even to increase the authorization to 40 or 50 million to adjust for inflation. The Congress also recommended fully funding REAP from the 1.8 billion dollar state surplus this year. There is no good reason for the legislature not to fully fund this program to the original amount. The most crucial motion was to fund the Natural Resource and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund, which would fully fund REAP and many other conservation programs in perpetuity!

A great showing of County Conservation staff and board members were present; thanks to everyone who participated in REAP Assemblies and Congress this year and Rod Marlatt of Fayette CCB for serving as Chairman of the Congress. We hope your efforts and the recommendations of the Congress will inform the Governor and legislature and that REAP will receive the full funding that is available.



DISTRICT I MEETING

Polk County Conservation hosted District 1 on January 18th at the Sleepy Hollow Sports Park in Des Moines. Director Rich Leopold and Deputy Director Kami Rankin gave updates on what is going on in Polk and, specifically, the future of the sports park. Eventually, the park will have a new lodge and one-of-a-kind winter sports facilities. The big attraction will be an all-season surface called Snow Flex, which will allow users to tube, ski, and snowboard year-round! Not to mention, this is the world's largest surface of its kind!

Representatives from Shive Hattery gave a presentation about the renovation of Easter Lake Park and detailed the process of making it one of the most inclusive parks in the Country. The park is undoubtedly one of a kind and offers an incredible number of accessible features for all to enjoy. LWCF CHANGES FOR 2024

Due to Governor Reynold's Executive Order 10, the Iowa DNR is working through an administrative rule review of the chapter that governs the administration of the Land and Water Conservation Fund. The proposed changes include removing scoring criteria from the rule, removing assistance caps based on population, and increasing the maximum award amount to \$250,000 per project. Due to these expected changes that would greatly benefit our applicants, the Iowa DNR is modifying the 2024 LWCF local grant cycle.

LWCF grant applications are normally due annually on March 15. LWCF applications for the 2024 cycle will be due to the DNR by June 15, 2024. Application materials will

be posted on the DNR's LWCF website in March.
