I.C.C.S. SELECTS ADAM J. SHIRLEY FOR NEW CEO!

Following a dedicated recruiting process which commenced on May 13th, ICCS is pleased to present Adam Shirley, Director for the Mitchell CCB as the new CEO for our state Association - replacing Tom Hazelton as of 1/1/2023. Adam comes to ICCS from ten years of service with the MCCB, and with an impressive educational background - a Professional Science Master's in Ecosystem Management from UNI, a BA in Environmental Science from Dordt College, and an AA from North Iowa Area Community College. Adam is a Past President & Vice President of the CCDA; served on the Iowa PF State Council from 2012 to present; and as a Naturalist Intern for the Sioux CCB in 2008 and 2009 Land Stewardship Intern for INHF. He has previously served as a Roadside Biologist for the Cerro Gordo CCB, a Roadside Technician for the Iowa Valley RC&D, and as a Graduate Assistant at UNI.

ICCS is currently working with Adam on administrative essentials for a smooth transition to "something new" in financial arenas, accounting, CCB communications and several other CCB "ways of doin' things"! Many of you know Adam as an active member of District 2, and a general presence at most statewide conferences and legislative initiatives. He plans to attend the regular quarterly meeting of the ICCS Board of Directors in November, and will begin a month of transitioning into the CEO position on December 1st. Adam & Tom will be meeting with numerous industry partners across the state – within the natural resources community, Iowa Tourism, legislative connections and others. He comes to ICCS with a wealth of institutional knowledge already, and will get it bolstered with historic perspectives and "satellite views" from Hazelton as the days and weeks progress towards the end of 2022.

Adam will assume full responsibilities for ICCS operations & networking the first week of January 2023, and we hope you will collectively welcome him into his new role. He will be working from his home office in Osage, IA – but the email address and phone number will not be changing at this time – <u>IACCB@mycountyparks.org</u> / (515) 963-9582 will be transferred to Adam at the end of the year. You WILL see some changes occurring through our transition processes – including: mailing address for the organization, a new email address for the MyCountyParks.com Division, and additional modifications from the way we have been conducting ICCS business since 2011. 
