SF2323 - DNR & CCB Land Inventory - Homework Assignment in January

The Most

County Conservation Program in the United States

The state of Iowa is blessed with many natural wonders that we some-times overlook. The most obvious is our black soil which allows us to be one of the primary row crop states in the country. We also have two primary tributaries which form our eastern and western boundaries that have been the bject of many novels and classics which are known by people all over the world — the Mississippi and the Missouri Rivers. Approximately four per-cent of lowa's surface is covered by timberland with the heaviest concentra-tions in the eastern countries of the state and approximately 3,000 acres of native and approximately 3,000 acres or nanve prairie which has never been touched by the plow. Because of our emphasis on crop and livestock production and the large amount of valuable crop land, we must work especially hard to preserve our natural wonders and provide outdoor areas for Iowans to enjoy in their



Some people are surprised when they learn that Iowa is also a leader in the conservation movement in the United States. In 1934, a 25-year plan for conservation was prepared by renowned conservationists such as Ding Darling and Aldo Leopold. This plan formed the basis for some very unique pro-grams that originated in Iowa. One of the suggestions of this plan was to find a way to provide additional conservation way to provide additional conservation and outdoor recreation programs at the local level.
