

"Campers spent 355 nights at the Thorpe Park Campground in 2020, compared to 195 in 2019 – an increase of 82%; At Dahle Park, site occupancy increased from 77 camping nights in 2019 to 279 nights in 2020 – a whopping 262% increase year to year!" 


TRAINING MODULES: (PDF documents) These can be located by going to our ICCS administrative website, MyCountyParks.org, and to the drop-down tab for "DIVISIONS", then select "MCP.COM ADMINISTRATION". This location makes them publicly available to you all without having to jump through the sign-in aspects of The Portal. The current list of PDF learning documents are on the left here, and a sampling of the videos to the right. We also plan to record the "MCP.com 101" training program next week and post it to this same location.

Eventually, these sort of items will be housed in the actual ADMIN portions of the MyCountyParks.com website so that they can be easily accessed when you are logged in as an administrator and working within the website - but for now, a good step in that direction!

Within the next couple of months, we will surpass the mark of 50% of all CCBs having migrated to providing online reservations/registrations for facilities and/or events – be sure to let me know if you would like to have a conversation about maximizing these opportunities for your CCB. We know that there are 26,000+ events provided across our system each year, but only 1,900-ish of them appear on MCP.com for registration – lots of room for improvement here! 😊

NEW MCP SECURITY PROFILES

This involved some updates and additions due to requests for other opportunities over the past couple of years. This link (above) will get you to the new MCP.com Division Page on our administrative website - MyCountyParks.org. As with all the goodies referenced above, a fresh PDF document at the top of the web page will walk you through the eight distinct security profile levels that are available to access MCP.com and The Portal. Each County has staff that may require various levels of access to either or both of the MyCountyParks.com website and The IACCB Portal. We have completed these recent modifications to at least accommodate some of the requests we have received for access over the past couple of years. You will note that the website County Administrator(s) you have for your CCB may be able to create/modify profiles for most needs of employees. Beyond what now currently exists as profile options - we will be collecting additional input and requests that you may have for future adjustments, but those may likely be a year+ away. COVID-19 RELIEF FUNDING COMING TO TRAILS THROUGH D.O.T?

SOME FACTS: The December 2020 signing of the Coronovirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 is providing \$121.9M of federal highway COVID-19 relief to Iowa. In developing funding allocation recommendations – one goal was to allocate a portion to address lost state revenue for trail development. The allocation of relief funding for trails is intended to reflect the COVID-19 impact on current and future state

appropriations for trails. As you may know, the State Recreational Trail program received a lower-than-normal appropriation in Fiscal Year 2021 due to COVID-19 impacts on Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund revenue which comes primarily from gaming taxes. An estimate of shovel-ready needs for trails in Iowa is near \$400M for new trails, and \$152M for major trail maintenance. Input from INHF and other organizations suggested minimum funding in the \$5M - \$10M range; prioritize shovel-ready projects; prioritize projects connecting destinations; minimizing match requirements; minimize federal regulations through smart administration, etc. We are optimistic that we will hear more soon about these exciting opportunities, but also remaining cognizant that no one is sure what this will eventually look like, and many things could change rapidly!?
