ICCS BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

For the first time since November 2019, the ICCS Board of Directors had the opportunity to meet in-person on May 20th at the Jester Park Nature Center in Polk County. Three new members were sworn-in by Board President – Mark Shoemaker (Pottawattamie): Victoria DeVos (Plymouth), IAN Representative; Brad Mormann (Jones), IACCBE Representative; and Paige Shafer (Wapello), AFIRM Representative. Welcome Aboard!

Annually, this spring quarterly meeting is generally all about finances as the proposed budgets for both ICCS and MyCounty Parks.com for the upcoming fiscal year are reviewed and approved. The ICCS Operating Budget for FY2022 was approved at \$206,450; and the separate budget for MyCountyParks.com operations was approved at \$183,900. The Board also endorsed some conceptual planning towards FY2023 as they prepare to transition to a new CEO at the end of 2022.

A reminder that **Western Region CCBs** (Districts 3 & 4) have until May 31st to cast their ballots for the Region's Conservation Board Member Representative to the ICCS Board of Directors.

The link to the Survey Monkey Ballot was sent to all CCB Directors in the Region on April 1st via email. To-date, 11 of the 34 CCBs in this Region have cast ballots. There is one vote allowed to be cast per county. Please contact Tom if you have any questions.



CALL FOR BOARD MEMBER CANDIDATES

The ICCS Central Region (Districts 1 & 2) has an opening for a Conservation Board Member Representative to serve on the ICCS Board of Directors. The three-year term for this service will be from Sept. 2021 thru Sept. 2024, with the option to serve one additional consecutive term. We already have one board member candidate that has applied. Balloting for this election will occur in July & August – with announcement of the successful candidate to be made at the 2021 ICCS Annual Meeting at the fall conference in September.

PORTAL CONTACT REPORT

QUARTERLY PORTAL CONTACTS HARVEST COMPLETED

Earlier this month we completed our quarterly email scoop of the CONTACTS in the Portal. We appear to have 1,004 "good" email addresses across the system - a slight uptick from the previous harvest. We have 374 of 495 Board Members (76%); 531 of 575 Employees (93%); and all 100 Directors (100%). While this is guite awesome - considering from where we started in 2013 - we still encourage you to be diligent about keeping your CCBs portion of the CONTACTS up-to-date, especially for Board Members. We did, however have to correct about a dozen that were missing characters or had other errors in the address, and toss another 3 dozen as they bounced on our initial distributions....so always room for improvement!

REMEMBERING JIM PETERS, BREMER CCB


In January, Jim was appointed to his seventh 5-year term on the Bremer County Conservation Board, and was elected to serve as Chairman – a position he held 12 other times since his initial appointment in 1987. Sadly, Jim passed away in early February, leaving behind a lasting imprint on the parks and wildlife areas in Bremer County. He rarely missed a meeting in these 34 years, and was always available to chat on the phone or send an email. He knew his role as a conservation board member, and took that roll very seriously. Jim was passionate about conservation and wanted to do his part to make the parks and wildlife areas better places to visit. Jim had been instrumental in much of the expansion of the BCCB over the past 3.5 decades – from 20 areas and 1,051 acres to 31 areas and 4,400+ acres.....along with many upgrades in services and infrastructure. The time, effort and knowledge that he graciously shared all these years was greatly appreciated and will be truly missed. May he rest in peace......
