Purpose:

The Ranger of The Year award is to give recognition of an exceptional act or service by a Ranger in their community. Either through acts of Valor, Public Service, Lifesaving measures, or through great police work.

The day to day activities of our Rangers are a vital element to the people and communities we serve. Use this opportunity to recognize the excellent acts, or continued accomplishments, of those Rangers.

Criteria for Nomination:

Please look over the criteria below and nominate a Ranger that you know is deserving of one, or more, of these categories. Self-nominations are encouraged.

Valor: Conscious of danger, a Ranger distinguishes themselves by the outstanding performance of an act of gallantry, valor, personal heroism, or exceptional bravery at imminent personal hazard to their life which exceeds the normal expectations of job performance.

Public Service: When a Ranger, through initiative, creates or participates in a program or system which has a significant positive impact on their community which exceeds normal expectations of job performance by organizing programs, events, interpretive displays, etc.

Lifesaving: When a Ranger, while acting within their scope of duties, saves the life of another person. Administering aid in a life-threatening situation such as CPR, applying a tourniquet, etc.

Commitment and Excellence in Law Enforcement: When a Ranger shows dedication to providing a safe community in which they serve by their actions in law enforcement through investigations, arrests, etc.
