

> **Bike the Trout Run Trail** Take a ride at one of Northeast Iowa's most popular trails. The group will bike a 5-mile stretch of level terrain with great views of the Upper Iowa and a trout stream. Bring your own bike. \$10 fee.

LARRY REIS

ECOLOGY OF THE DRIFTLESS

Larry Reis is a venerable naturalist and natural resource manager for Winneshiek County Conservation. Over the past forty years, Larry has been the pre-eminent natural historian in our region. He has put his extensive knowledge to good use through careful stewardship of our parklands and teaching over a hundred programs each year.

He is the author of *Noting Nature*, a memoir based on his phenological records, and *Once a Trapper*, a biography of his father focused on his outdoor pursuits. Larry's dedication and love for the natural world is evident in both his writing & his daily life.

For the past 13 years Larry has maintained an extensive Flickr photography account documenting wildlife, seasonal changes, and natural resources in Winneshiek County, northeast Iowa, and across the nation. He now has more than 17,000 professional-quality photos, which he makes available for public download at no charge. GREGG PATTISON

BLUFFS, BATS, AND BUMBLEBEES

Gregg Pattison is a private lands biologist with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service working for the Iowa Private Lands Office. Gregg focuses his efforts working with landowners and partner organizations to restore, create and manage high quality wildlife habitat to meet the individual goals of the landowner.



His work emphasizes pollinator habitat in the Driftless Area with a specific focus on creating high quality habitat for rusty patched bumble bees and monarch butterflies. Gregg has been with the USFWS for over 30 years working mainly with prairie and oak savanna restoration.

BRIAN FANKHAUSER

BLUFFLAND PROTECTION

Brian Fankhauser is the Senior Land Stewardship and Blufflands Director with the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation (INHF). Working closely with a dedicated staff, he oversees the land stewardship efforts on INHF-protected lands across the state. In addition to his land stewardship duties, Brian works with private landowners, public agencies and partners to protect important natural areas in Northeast Iowa.

Prior to starting at INHF in 2005, he worked at Hamilton County Conservation Board for 9 years where he helped develop and care for their natural areas including prairies and wetlands. Brian graduated from Iowa State University with a degree in Animal Ecology.

MIKE SIEPKER

TROUT RESTORATION IN THE IOWA DRIFTLESS

Mike Siepker is the supervisor of Northeast Iowa fisheries management and coldwater hatchery operations for the Iowa DNR, overseeing three coldwater hatcheries, two fish management teams that manage public fisheries across 15 counties, and one watershed coordinator.

Previously, Mike served ten years as the Decorah District Fisheries Biologist for the lowa DNR and was responsible for managing the fisheries resources within an eight-county district in Northeast Iowa. During that time, Siepker oversaw the district's coldwater stream monitoring and research, stream habitat improvements, and trout restoration efforts. Prior to moving back to Iowa, Siepker spent ten years as a Sportfish Population Ecologist with the Missouri Department of Conservation, overseeing statewide sportfish research and management evaluations.

Fayette County Tour

This tour will focus on a variety of traditional and non-traditional conservation, tourism, and marketing programs.

> The tour will showcase the Scenic Byways program along with a stop at Goeken Park to experience the amazing overlook and incorporated public art.

> > We will then transition to Watershed Management Authority programs and our Otter Creek projects including on-road structures, private practices, and modeling.

> > > The tour will wind its way into the Driftless and land at the Gilbertson Conservation Education Area for lunch and live experiences. This flagship park includes the Nature Center, Playscape, historical museums, and Avenue of Flags.

> > > > We will depart from Gilbertson and travel to the Kauten Fen to experience the history and botanical uniqueness of one of the state's best fens.

Winneshiek County Tour



Lake Meyer: Off the Impaired Waters List

Lake Meyer is Winneshiek County's only lake, and it was recently taken off the EPA's Impaired Waters List. Partnerships and coordination between farmers, the DNR, Soil & Water District and other conservation efforts are showcased at this beautiful spot. Other tour features included several styles of docks, a timber frame picnic shelter and habitat restoration work.

Walden Pond: A One in a Million Donation

This 133-acre park was recently donated with several buildings including rental homes, enclosed shelter, and a small bathhouse. The landscape includes a 5-acre pond, a productive sugar maple forest, prairie plantings, and a stretch of the Yellow River.



Freeport Park: A Pocket Pollinator Park

A 2.5-acre property in the heart of a developing area was turned into a pollinator park with funding from a local company and a group of dedicated trail volunteers. The site features a recreational trail, timber frame picnic shelter, playground, prairie and diverse tree plantings - all in one small space.

Dry Run Greenbelt: Packaging Projects and Building Partnerships

Home of the Rusty Patched Bumble Bee and savanna oak forest, the Dry Run Greenbelt bundles multiple land uses. Development of the Dry Run Trail will provide a link between the Trout Run Trail and the Prairie Farmer Recreational Trail while also preserving the area along Dry Run Creek, which flows into Decorah. This in-progress project will not only connect the trails and convert old pasture to prairie but also incorporate flood mitigation structures and a new wetland development to protect the City of Decorah.



Exploring the Driftless Tour

This tour will provide an opportunity to learn from organizations beyond the world of county conservation as well as the chance to see some of the most scenic spots in the Decorah area.

The trip will begin by driving along the Driftless Area Scenic Byway with two visits to local seed companies. Shooting Star Native Seeds in Spring Grove, MN offers a wide range of native prairie seeds for habitat restoration. Seed Savers Exchange specializes in preserving heirloom garden seeds and apple varieties on a beautiful 900-acre farm.



The group will visit the redesigned outdoor display area at the Vesterheim Norwegian-American Museum and several highlights of the Decorah area parks system, including an algific talus slope, spring-fed waterfalls, the state-owned Decorah Fish Hatchery and famous Decorah Eagle Nest.



Wednesday Night Recycling Cartoons provided by Fayette County Conservation!



Meet Mike, Nellie, Wally, and Bob in this 'kid" friendly series, designed to promote recycling, watersheds, and scenic byways. In a series of fun and short animated videos, Mike the Milk Jug, Nellie the Newspaper, Wally the Watershed Master, and Bob the Byway Bus all share their life stories, written by and using the comedic and musically talented voices of Rod Marlatt, Director of Fayette County Conservation, and Mallory Hanson of Fayette County, Economic Development and Tourism. This ongoing project helps show the benefits of recycling, watersheds, and byways to "kids" in a fun, creative way that they will remember forever.
