lowans..."REAP"ing the Benefits for Three Decades

For three decades Iowan's have enjoyed the diverse benefits of the Resource Enhancement and Protection (REAP) Program. REAP is a state program that provides funding for lowa's diverse natural and cultural resources. The program is authorized to receive up to \$20 million dollars annually until 2021 and is funded through gaming receipts and the sale of REAP license plates; however, the appropriation is set by the legislature and actually averages just \$11 million per year. The program is administered by the Department of Transportation, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Cultural Affairs, and the Department of Agricultural and Land Stewardship

The groundbreaking REAP legislation was signed into law on May 27, 1989 Matt Cosgrove by Governor Terry Brandstad following a two-year study committee recommendation, a unanimous vote in the House, and a 40-6 vote in the Senate. Representatives from over 25 diverse organizations worked with law-makers to create the REAP Formula: a spending formula that has remained virtually unchanged for 30 years, serving as a testament to the important and time-

Located within less than an hour of the Omaha Metro and nestled in the beautiful Loess Hills of western lowa, Harrison County has the best of both worlds with nearby city attractions and rural living. A drive to the city will get you shopping malls, museums, restaurants, and a zoo. Closer to home, small towns dot the rural landscape amongst the farms with local shops and artists, qualint eateries, cobblestone streets, and unique community attractions. Being this close to a major city gives residents many opportunities; however, there is the want and need to step out your back door and be able to explore the natural world within just a few minutes. Not only for our residents...but those that live in the urban areas are wanting to escape their normalcy to experience rural lowa.

The Harrison County Conservation Board (HCCB) meets those needs with 18 areas encompassing nearly 1,800 acres of outdoor recreation for fishing, camping, hunting, and hiking, to mane just a few. The Missouri River borders Harrison County on the west, with flats rising dramatically into the wind-blown Loess Hills and its water carved ravines. Native prairies, wetlands, and forests intertwine throughout the hills and the county. These areas also draw visitors and tourists exiting off the interstate to explore the back roads and discover new places.

One of the most popular areas, as well as the main headquarters for HCCB, is the sthelson@harrisoncountyparks.org Willow take Recreation Area, located along a winding road just outside of Wood-





